Job Overview

We are seeking an organized and experienced **Workforce and Training Coordinator** to contribute to training and workforce development efforts within the **ISO-in-a-Box Project**, a pioneering initiative to streamline ISO certification processes in public health pathogen genomics and bioinformatics.

This role combines stakeholder engagement, and training facilitation, with the ultimate goal of enhancing the capacity of teams in bioinformatics and pathogen genomics to meet international quality standards.

As a team member in the **training work package**, the applicant will work closely with key stakeholders, including **Wellcome Connecting Science (WCS)**, and assist the Senior training coordinator in the development, and delivery of impactful training programs on making and using bioinformatics workflows suitable for use in quality-sensitive public health laboratories and research institutions.

Key Responsibilities

- **Project Management:**
 - Work alongside the Senior training coordinator to compile, and disseminate regular progress reports and project updates to stakeholders.
- **Training Development and Delivery:**
 - Facilitate engaging and effective training sessions for diverse audiences, including researchers, public health professionals, and laboratory staff.
 - Evaluate training outcomes and incorporate feedback to continuously improve program content and delivery.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:**
 - Assist in building and maintaining strong relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including public health agencies, academic institutions, and industry partners.
 - Assisting ISO in a Box project leadership in scoping and planning pilot projects.
- **Contribution to Quality Management systems:**

- Contributing to the development of frameworks and templates for the design and use of “ISO certification ready” bioinformatics workflows in public health laboratories engaged in pathogen genome sequencing.

- Some experience in training facilitation, specifically in the bioinformatics or public health pathogen genomics space.
- Exceptional communication and interpersonal skills for engaging diverse audiences.

- Familiarity with ISO certification processes, particularly in public health laboratories or genomic research.
- Experience in coordinating training programs in resource-limited settings.
